

Our Lady of Guadalupe Abbey is located 25 miles east of Santa Fe. The mailing address is P.O. Box 1080, Pecos, NM 87552-1080. The street address is 16 Guadalupe Lane, Pecos, NM 87552.

From Santa Fe take North I-25 to exit 299, NM50, Glorieta. Cross over the freeway and turn right on NM50. Proceed to the main intersection in Pecos and turn left on NM63. The Abbey is about 1½ miles on the left.

From Las Vegas take South I-25 to exit 307, NM63, Rowe. Proceed north to Pecos. Continue through the main intersection. The Abbey is about 1½ miles on the left.

The Abbey owns about 1,000 acres in the Pecos River Canyon. The property is easily accessible. There is only one two-lane road in the canyon. There are no airports, railroads or other sources of noise in the area. The property abuts the Santa Fe National Forest. The property includes:

- Ample base camp and crew parking
- About one mile of undeveloped riverfront
- A large undeveloped lake

Locations of potential interest on the property include:

- A 50' X 35' auditorium that may be used as a commissary
- A 65' X 35' warehouse with garage door that may be used for food preparation and/or equipment, prop, vehicle storage

- Bank and gas stations with mountain backdrop
- Rural post office

- Pecos National Historic Park
- Forked Lightning Ranch
- Rustic country store
- Several atmospheric bars, cafes, restaurants
- Terrero Mine milling station reclamation area
- Miles of scenic paved and dirt roads
- Numerous rustic homes and cabins
